Yeeeesssss..... Nooooooo!!!!

The soundproofing in the Vicarage is pretty good – but this ever the sound-deadening infill in the floor space between my study his sitting room is proving insufficient to suppress the cura excited shouts as England play America in Rustenburg. You di imagine that, did you: Father Richard, hushed-toned doyen Newsnight Review, a closet football fan? You should have he the highly-partisan intercessions at Morning Prayer today! Foot brings out primal emotions, turning the most effete liberals (no, you Father!) into baying brutes, and curates into cheer-leaders.

Venturing out into the warm sun at Hyde Park Corner on Fri afternoon, I was astonished - on the opening day of the month-l FIFA World Cup finals - by the number of cars, taxis and lor sporting red and white flags, and men, women and child wearing England t-shirts, hats and even face paint. Having b brought up in Scotland (paradoxically the country with the jo oldest international football team in the world but with a history of *never* making it past the first round in the World Cu don't really 'get' all of this football thing... But take me Murrayfield for a Six Nations match, and that, inexplicably, precisely the same effect: and sees me turned from a cauti considered cleric always ready to see subtlety and differentia within shades of grey, into a polarised, partisan fanatic gripped an intense and irrational nationalism and – more alarming! disdain verging on hatred for the other side.

Jekyll and Hyde? Something close to it – and a quality and capa that lurks not far beneath the surface in most of us. Our venee peace-loving sophistication is just that: a veneer... and one th easily peeled away. Football (and its superior stable-mate Rug are the acceptable face of all of this, and perhaps a safe mod conduit for passions that run deep and often find expression in most passive forms of aggression. But the differences are onl degree and the steps between relatively small. At Morning Pra we've just finished a tortuous three-week canter through the B of Joshua (an every-day tale of passionate rivalry issuing in effi Iron-age ethnic-cleansing), and away from the pages of Scripti the media often convey tales of modern-day killing fields in wl apparently civilized human beings become so gripped by the po of 'battle excitement' and its attendant adrenalin rush that riv effortlessly turns into ruthless persecution and a desire annihilate. Vuvuzelas deafening players and supporters in Jo'b trumpets bringing down the walls of Jericho... the difference c one of degree.

With an eye on the football in the coming month, good also to k a weather-eye on ourselves... to see the best of what we can and the worst of what we can all too easily become.
