### *No gain without pain...*

At precisely five feet tall and with long, bright pink dyed hair super-charged, diminutive Zandra Rhodes), Francesca mal impact. Francesca is a personal trainer... No, (I've waited for years to say this) Francesca is my personal trainer (a personal is surely the ultimate Belgravia accessory!). In fact she is my treat to myself: what I have 'taken on' in an attempt, before too late, to instil some physical rigour in an all-too-sedentary li some fitness and muscle tone to an all-too-corpulent body (c really believe that clergy wear black for some other reason th: it is a slimming colour?). The legacy of my first sessions ("c'mc give me another ten of those, Alan...") - aches in places I didn' I could ache, a stiffness that makes genuflection a real chall but also, as the pain recedes, the beginnings of a sense thal might be hope and that change might be possible. "No gain v pain," as they say! Be warned, dear readers, stay out of Hyde F Friday mornings: it is not, as yet, a pretty sight.

"No gain without pain" might almost be shorthand for the th of Passiontide – a season that begins this Sunday (Lent 5) and e through Palm Sunday and Holy Week to the dawn of Easter D: term 'Passiontide' is derived from the Greek verb *paschō* – to (the Western Church derived the term from the Latin \ *'passio'*) – and Passiontide is therefore that season in annually, the people of God connect again with the events of t days of our Lord as he enters Jerusalem and prepares f struggle, persecution and, finally, the death that occurs on a Hill outside the city wall on Good Friday. This re-engagement story of pain, cruelty and suffering is not some morbid exer bleak, masochistic endeavour: there is no virtue in telling a sa for its own sake, still less in self-absorbed Christian gloor Passiontide is about something rather more than these. . Passion Gospels tell again the story, the preaching and refle prayers and meditations make a connection between this si suffering and our story – and assure us not only that God remote from what we experience (but, in Christ, has everywhere we are expected to go, even to death), but also and through struggle and suffering there is a hope of new life God's promise and most astonishing gift. Gain through pain the promise of life transformed by God in a way so much wonderful than anything we can achieve ourselves... even v encouragement of the wondrous Francesca!
