## **COST AND PASSION : TRUE DISCIPLESHIP**

'spiritual How do we take our temparatures'? How healthy are our souls? my Faith and its practice merely ls 'respectable', too cerebral, too polite and conventional? These questions among others have been in my mind this past week in the light of two things. Firstly the appaulling assault on Christians leaving Mass at All Saints Church in Peshawar in Pakistan, coupled with reports of the active persecution of (Anglican) Chitstians in Egypt. Is my faith so strong and firm that, moving beyond mere convention, I would still be at Mass this morning if I knew that I and my family could be killed as I walk out of the front door and that at least my livelihood and business interests and so my finacnial security will be targeted for anhililation? Would I be here this morning if I knew that tomorrow I would have no job and no pay check just because I had attended Mass? "Where your treasure is , there will your heart be also". And it is that way roundheart follows treasure! Also I read last week a sermon by a Canadian priest in the USA whom I and one of my former parishes sponsored for ordination twenty or more years ago. He wrote that in the pratcice of our Christian faith we cannot love too much, cannot be too passionate, and cannot give enough. True, I think, unless, of course, the exercise of my Faith is merely conventional. Am I really passionately in love with God, as I am led to believe that God is with me, with us. There is much on offer here at St. Paul's Knightsbridge to help us love more, as Jesus so surely loves us.


