## Ahem! While you are waiting...

Familiarity – they say – breeds contempt. Familiarity with a building certainly breeds indifference. What once struck you forceably becomes, very quickly, ‘the place I always go’, and you stop noticing. It is true of the houses we live in: the crack in the cornice which once we could *not* avoid noticing has now become something we *don't* see. It is true of our cities: as inhabitants we tend not to notice what visitors see so readily – the beauty of the architecture and of the whole built environment. And in a church? Well, quite apart from the cracks and the imperfections there, we stop being aware of what struck us once with such force: the noble lines or soaring arches, the holiness and the presence of God. Familiarity has dulled our senses.

So, this week, an exercise in noticing anew. A short reflection as you enter St Paul's to ‘refocus’ your attention and to draw you back to why you have come here in the first place. Jacob, the book of Genesis, wrestled with God and woke to recognise the place he was in as holy ground: *Jacob was afraid, and said, How awesome is this place! This is none other but the house of God, and this is the gate of heaven.* (Genesis 28:17). It is a passage often inscribed above the doors of churches. Make it your text for today. Notice anew. Dare to remark on holiness – and then use this prayer of Eric Milner-White:



Let me come into the church of God  
To meet the Spirit of God;  
Not to give religion an hour,  
But to live in the eternal;  
Not to maintain a decorous habit,  
But to bow in the holy place before the Holy One;  
Not to judge the words of a preacher,  
But to draw life from the Word and Truth everlasting;  
Not to be moved or soothed by music,  
But to sing from the heart divine praises;  
Not that my eyes roam over architecture or congregation,  
But that my soul look up to the King in his beauty,  
And my heart pleads the needs of his children;  
Not that my thoughts escape out into the world,  
But that they be still, and know that you are God.  
Let me go, and go again, into the house of the Lord,  
And be glad, and give thanks, adore my King and my God.




