ONE MORE DAY

I've had several conversations this summer with people about length of life and the burden of old age – which I know, for some, is real. And I also had an encounter and a conversation with an Actuary whose business is thinking about the real cost of life in business and finance. He happened to be a Christian, our conversation was wide-ranging and it got me thinking....

If you are *lucky*, you might live to be 100 or more, provided you live in Western Europe, Australia or North America. You are *likely* to live well into your

80s. Global actuarial tables reveal two things: first, that when it comes to average length of life there is huge disparity between regions of the world, and second that it is good news that we live *where* and *when* we do. Over recent centuries economic factors, differences in public health provision, medical care and diet have seen life expectancy

in the United Kingdom stretch beyond anything our ancestors could have imagined possible. If this sometimes feels like a burden to those struggling with the frailties of older age, it is, arguably, also an astonishing advance. It is all about averages, of course, but we are *likely* to enjoy longer life than any generation before us in the history of the world.


However, of course there are no guarantees! *Media Vita In Morte Sumus*: in the midst of life we are in death. Scripture talks of life as a breath of wind, a vapour, a spark and as a precious but fleeting gift. There is no certainty that we will, inevitably, share in the good fortune of longer life. We will certainly spend much longer dead than we ever do alive and once this life is over there are no second chances. There is no pause button. Or replay. No reset button. It is once and for all. Life *is* a fleeting and precious gift and it is too important to waste.

But you are in luck. The good news is that today is a very special day because you are still alive. Which means you have one more day to make this life count! You have one more day to change the trajectory of your life. You have one more day to stop

living in the past or chasing empty promises and instead to focus on the only things that matter: living for the day, loving God and loving others.

As they say in Scotland, "you're a long time dead!" There is no guarantee of tomorrow. But you have today. Make it count.


