

4 May 2014: THE THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER

PILGRIMS

As Fr. Alan mentioned at our Annual Church Meeting last Sunday, the theme for our work of Christian formation for adults this academic year has been "Pilgrimage". We have taken that quite literally, and have sponsored pilgrimages to Westminster Abbey (twice), Canterbury Cathedral, Alsace and will this week participate in the annual "Choral Pilgrimage" with the renowned singers, The Sixteen. We shall have watched a secular movie, read and discussed a secular novel (17 May) on the theme of pilgrimage. Yesterday we looked at the Saturday Forum at the meaning and structure of the Eucharist, that "food to pilgrims given". On Wednesday evenings we have made a pilgrimage of the heart and mind to penetrate more deeply the essential mysteries of the Christian Faith which in turn lead us to journey more deeply into Christ himself.

I was struck this past week as I journeyed back from the Shrine of Our lady of Walsingham, (before the Reformation and since the 11th century one of the most important places of pilgrimage in Europe and still a place where some 30,000 pilgrims make a journey for a few days pilgrimage each year) of the importance of movement in our Christian journey. No movement, no journey. One of the lessons at Morning

Prayer this past week was God's gift of the Manna to the pilgrim people of Israel, a gift given daily until they had reached their Godgiven goal of the Promised Land, in other words as long as they were "on the move". The Manna foreshadows of course that other Bread from heaven, the gift of the Lord's own Body and Blood in the sacrament of Holy Communion. It likewise is given to us, a pilgrim people, assumed to be journeying towards our God-given goal of full union with the Risen Lord.

These days of Easter (yes, there are fifty of them not seven!), might provide a time for us to reflect as a community and as individuals, as to the truth of that assumption of movement in our spiritual lives that is made at every Mass. How in the past year have we grown more Christlike as a congregation? How have you and I been more deeply converted to Jesus, the Risen Lord? How have we allowed that same Lord to be our guide and goal in that journey? What concrete steps have we taken to seize the opportunities for growth and development? How does my commitment to growth and development in my spiritual life compare with the same in other areas of my life? Or, if I am honest, am I still stuck immobile wherever my last Confirmation class left me? How have we placed ourselves to be moved along from just churchgoers to Christians who are fully alive? We are blessed that such opportunities abound within this community of faith. Carpe Diem!

If you have ideas about the journeys we might embark upon next year, do come to the two Wednesday evening sessions following the 6.45 PM Mass on 14 and 21 May.


