PRAY - ACT - GIVE

Erm, what's that?!

It's the letter 'N'. In Arabic – which has, in recent weeks been daubed on the doors of Christian households (often called 'Nasrani' in Arabic) in Mosul in Northern Iraq as a sign that the occupants should be persecuted – or killed. Images of Christians crucified or beheaded are to be found in propaganda on the web, their presence there betraying the fact of terrible atrocities.

and Mosul, Christians Muslims (and many other faiths and sects) have coexisted in relative harmony for 1400 years. What has changed is the sudden and virulent spread of ruthless fundamentalism following the establishing of the so-called Caliphate by ISIS. The result has been a ruthless purging of all who are not Muslim or who will not convert to Islam.


This week our Archbishop and the Bishop of London — in

common with many other Bishops of the Church of England – have urged all Anglican Christians to express their prayerful solidarity with those being persecuted and exterminated, and to do three things: **PRAY**; **ACT**; **GIVE**.

PRAY. A prayer for your use is printed below, and others are available on the CofE website. Please will you pray daily?

The second request is to **ACT**. What can we possibly do? I'd suggest at least two obvious things. First, will you visit the CofE website and read the Archbishop's appeal, and then consider lobbying your local MP to ensure the Government does all it can to address the plight of the persecuted in Iraq.

Second, will you take home with you a copy of the poster or postcard with the 'N' on it and display it, somewhere where people will see it. It will provoke conversation and question. When it does, explain to people what it means – and then explain that what really matters is not just that we express our solidarity with those who are the victims of persecution in Iraq and do everything we can to aid them, but that we also ensure that as a society here



all faiths – especially at this time with our Muslim neighbours.

And on the same website you'll see links to enable you to give to the Diocese of Cyprus and Gulf where front line help is being provided to people in desperate need. Please will you **GIVE**, and give generously?

Let us pray.

God our deliverer, defender of the poor and needy; when the foundations of the earth are shaking, give strength to your people to uphold justice and fight all wrong, in the name of your son, Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen**.


