

THE PRESENTATION OF CHRIST: CANDLEMAS 1st February 2015

TIME PAST, TIME PRESENT, TIME FUTURE

The passage of time is part of the human condition. Sometimes the minutes seem to fly away, at other times they seem to drag terribly. 50 years ago as an eleven year old chorister at St. Paul's Cathedral it was my privilege to sing at the State Funeral of Sir Winston Churchill. I suppose his funeral is one of those occasions in the corporate memory of a nation when people may ask and people remember – "where were you when.....?"

So this past week has been a week of printed and moving images that stir the memory and indeed the emotion. One remembers great moments and little ones. I

remember Sir John Dykes-Bower, then Organist of St. Paul's, having a fit because with the great West Doors being opened for every head of state to come in from the cold and damp January air outside, it was throwing off the tuning of the organ. I remember our little 'crocodile' of thirty eight little boys dressed in

Eton suits going into the cathedral and to our amusement being stopped by security and asked who we were. I remember that once the service was finished we went straight back to the (old) Choir School on Carter Lane and carried on as though nothing had happened. Nor were we allowed to watch any television coverage that afternoon. So we never got to see the coffin being carried along the Thames or making its way to Bladon on the train.

Last Friday I bought a ticket to go on one of boats that formed part of the the commemorative flotilla that accompanied the Havengore from Tower Bridge to the Palace of Westminster where there was a brief service and a wreath was thrown onto the waters of the Thames with the Commons and the Lords looking on from the terraces. So it took fifty years, but I did eventually see the river bit of the funeral procession! Last week I also attended a dinner at the Choir School and exchanged memories of the day with other sixtysomethings harking back to their tender years! Some of those present sang at the Coronation in 1953 which made me feel

better!

Time and memory: Time past, time present, time future – all intricately intertwined and SO powerfully articulated in the Christian context by T. S. Eliot in his Four Quartets. Or, "Christ HAS died'; Christ IS risen; Christ WILL come again." "Do this in **REMEMBRANCE**"

("anamnesis" in Greek = "to make present again") of me." In our sacramental worship this morning, as always, time and space are intersected by eternity, the horizontal intersected by the vertical - a cross. A reminder of our Christian mission and witness to live in the embrace of eternity.
