A QUESTION OF FOCUS



On the film set, one of the most demanding (and undervalued) roles is that of '1st assistant camera', also known as the 'focus puller.' His or her job is to ensure that, at all times, the focus of the image is what the cameraman wants (and, of course, that paradoxically, doesn't always mean in sharp focus!). It is one of those jobs that is never noticed until it is done badly; to do the job requires an excellent well eve, mathematical brain and a keen knowledge of optical science. The stills photographer working alone, even with the benefits of modern auto-focussing cameras, requires all these skills and more.

My favourite photograph of the week was the brilliant Kai Pfaffenbach's amazing shot of Finland's Janne Ahonen as he soared past the judges' windows during a ski jumping event in the Nordic World Ski Championships in Falun, Sweden. It is the sort of photograph which, if you or I took it, would be dismissed as a failure! "Alan, what have you done: look, it is all out of focus! Try again." But of course it isn't; it is brilliantly focussed, but on something you don't expect.

As we continue in this holy season of Lent it is all a question of where we are looking (are we even looking in the right direction?!) and what we are seeing. To be more accurate, what are we seeing and what are we focussing upon. Our aim, to see beyond the externals of the season to the presence of Jesus Christ – his story and his example, and seeing him and him alone, to be drawn into fuller living. We are not meant to focus on what we are 'giving up', but rather on what that giving up makes possible, in us and through us, and by God's grace.

AMSTERDAM: PASSIONTIDE WEEKEND


Fr Alan Gyle warmly invites you to join him in Amsterdam for the
