

The Sixth Sunday of Eastertide 10th May 2015

THE 70th ANNIVERSARY OF VE DAY

Friday afternoon's wreath laying at the Cenotaph in Whitehall was the last appearance of several party leaders who had signalled their intention of resigning their posts as soon as this last public duty was out of the way. There was a strange irony in the juxtaposition of the General Election on Thursday and the celebration of the 70th

anniversary of VE day on Friday: the one so focussed on our divisions and differences, the other such celebration of unity in time of victory. This weekend Cathedral and Church bells have been rung, beacons have been lit, parties

and public events have been organised. Today, at Westminster Abbey, there is a national service of thanksgiving for the end of the Second World War in Europe.

Part of the Church of England's provision for special services this weekend is a so-called 'Act of Rededication' designed to be led by a Veteran of the Second World War and a young person. It weaves together two themes: past conflict and future commitment. It goes like this:

Voice 1: We fought for peace, that the world might never again know such violence and destruction.

Voice 2: Will you work for peace and reconciliation in your homes and

communities, and promote peace throughout the world?

All: With the help of God, we will.

Voice 1: We fought for justice, that the scourge of prejudice and oppression might never again take root in our societies.

Voice 2: Will you work for a world in which hatred and injustice never have the final

word, and where all people can flourish with dignity and hope?

All: With the help of God, we will.

Voice 1: We struggled so that the whole human family might know good will, security, and freedom.

Voice 2: Will you always acknowledge how precious are the gifts

which God has entrusted to us, and exercise the freedoms and responsibilities you have with gratitude and humility?

All: With the help of God, we will.

And it concludes: May almighty God, who has given us the will to undertake these things, bless us with the strength to perform them. **Amen**.

This focus on what has happened and what will be is powerful. It is a reminder that 'freedom' is always 'freedom for...' and never simply 'freedom from...'. The question is always: now that the conflict is over, what are we doing with the freedom won at so great a cost. A good question for a new set of MPs - but a good question for all citizens, for us.


THANK YOU

AND TO THE ENDS OF THE EARTH...

In the first chapter of the Acts of the Apostles, the Apostles are commissioned: "you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the

ends of the earth."

If you think about it 'spatially', the commission describes a series of concentric circles of witness, each pushing further out from the centre. That move from the centre out is - Christians have traditionally understood – part of the calling of God. It sits, though, uncomfortably, with our centripetal instinct to move anxiously from the outside back to the centre. One of the things that maddens many people about the Church is its parochialism and its obsession with its own life. God, by contrast, calls the Church away from self-obsession to healthy engagement with the world 'out there'. This coming term, we will be thinking about the move 'from the centre'. You will be welcome to join us.


