

THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT 22nd February 2015

BEING CHILDLIKE

Pablo Picasso's famous painting of his daughter 'Maya with her doll' was painted in 1938, a year after the creation of his famous *Guernica* (inspired by the atrocities of the Spanish Civil War), one of the most shocking depictions of human violence and arguably one of the most significant cultural

icons of the 20th century. By contrast with Guernica, this portrait is simple, charming, domestic. Yet Picasso's distorting cubist style is evident in the depiction of his daughter, and he plays in the painting with the idea of innocence and normality (note that the doll, unlike daughter, has his а 'normal' face!). Maya, for all her childish innocence, has a 'knowing' quality; there is а disturbing maturity about her; she 'sees', even as she is seen

by the artist. Being a child brought up against the background of violence is tough.

News on Friday that three teenage girls, Shamima Begum, 15, Kadiza Sultana, 16, and an unnamed 15-year-old girl, who all attended Bethnal Green Academy in Tower Hamlets, had fled to Turkey, thence to Syria to join ISIS, was shocking. Of course fifteen year olds are not infants, but what has happened to childhood – and what has gone wrong if schools in London are cradles for the radicalisation of those who should be playing and learning in safety, not fighting and killing? If our thoughts immediately turn to the question of whom to blame, perhaps a more fruitful reflection this Lent would be on what *we* are doing in our encounters with the young and innocent to sustain authentically childlike existence – and what that means we need to do for them, and for ourselves. Where does responsibility sit?



'Do for ourselves?' There is, somewhere in all of the task this. of monitoring our own capacity for being innocent, childlike and playful – rather than adult and cynical. Bishop George Appleton once wrote:1

Grant me, O God, the heart of a child, pure and transparent as a spring; a simple heart, which never harbours sorrows; a heart glorious in self-giving, tender in compassion; a heart faithful and

generous, which will never forget any good or bear a grudge for any evil. Make me a heart gentle and humble, loving without asking any return, largehearted and undauntable, which no ingratitude can sour and no indifference can weary; a heart penetrated by the love of Jesus whose desire will only be satisfied in heaven. Grant me, O Lord, the mind and heart of thy dear Son.

Innocence may be lost, but childlikeness *can* be restored. It was Pablo Picasso who said, "It takes a very long time to become young." be a guided tour of the religious art work at the Pallant House Museum, followed by tea at The Palace with



the Bishop of Chichester, The Rt Rev Martin Warner. At 17:30 there wil be the chance to attend Evensong at the Cathedral before we return to London. A long but satisfying day in one of our loveliest Cathedral cities and ancient shrines. 
