HE WHO SINGS...

Musick has Charms to sooth a savage Breast, To soften Rocks, or bend a knotted Oak. I've read, that things inanimate have mov'd, And, as with living Souls, have been inform'd, By Magick Numbers and persuasive Sound. William Congreve, writing at the end of the

seventeenth century, certainly understood the power of music to transform – not just the quiet, inward, prayerful transformation of the individual suggested by St Augustine ("He who sings," he wrote, "prays twice"), but the power to stir up a rabble, to create cohesion in a group and to unleash passion and energy in its


Two of the greatest exponents of the use of music to shift hearts and minds within the life of the Church are celebrated next week in a concert in central London, Ira David

collective action.

Sankey and Dwight Lyman Moody who, from the late 1870s onwards, toured the USA and the UK as evangelists, deploying the power of 'revivalist hymns'. The concert, in Methodist Central Hall, will see many of their greatest hymns dusted down and given a sing-thorough. This is very much a concert in which the audience will participate, actively!

Scripted by Tony Jasper who also plays D.L. Moody, the singing will be led by the Methodist Central Hall Choir, a Choral Quintet, and the powerful and persuasive voice of Tom Coltman, who is Ira D Sankey. The Great Hall organ will be played by

Andrew Furniss and the Director of Music at the Hall, Gerard Brooks, will be leading the singers and the hundreds attending in singing some of the mighty hymns from that time, some of which we still sing, as for instance 'Blessed Assurance' and 'To God Be The Glory'. The distinguished 19th century revival meeting benefactor Lady Serena has kindly consented to take the Chair. She is played by London West End theatre actress Ruth James.


