DEMOCRACY

A season of aggressive democracy is upon us! The question, whether we will see democracy merely as a 'right to vote', or as a set of rights with concomitant responsibilities? Those responsibilities might include making proper enquiry of those seeking election, pondering choices, and taking time to ask deep questions about our 'direction of travel'. Oh, and of course remembering to vote when the opportunity is presented! And this is true



of national elections and more locally too.

Nationally, the media is dominated by debate about noisy party policy manifestos and our postboxes are being stuffed with fliers urging us to vote this way or that. In truth, we seem to be in a new potical season in the UK, beyond the days of a simple two-party system and beyond 'left vs. right'; the way many cast their vote this time may have a real impact on the shaping of a governing coalition. Which way will you vote? And will your voting in any way be informed by your Christian convictions? On Thursday 30th April at 1pm, the Church has arranged the traditional 'hustings' at St Mary-leBow to allow parliamentary candidates contesting the seat of the cities of London and Westminster to present their policies and answer questions. In the first chapter of the Acts of the



Apostles, the Apostles are commissioned: "you will be my witnesses in Jerusalem, and in all Judea and Samaria, and to the ends of the earth." If you think about it 'spatially', the commission describes a

series of concentric circles of witness, each pushing further out from the centre. That move from the centre out is - Christians have traditionally understood – part of the calling of God. It sits, though, uncomfortably, with our centripetal instinct to move anxiously from the outside back to the centre. One of the things that maddens many people about the Church is its parochialism and its obsession with its own life. God, by contrast, calls the Church away from self-obsession to healthy engagement with the world 'out there'. This coming term, we will be thinking about the move 'from the centre'. You will be welcome to ioin us.


