

The Fifth Sunday after Trinity 5th July 2015

CALLING: II

Last week's sheet explored the idea of 'vocation' – that response to God's call in creation that *each* of us needs to make if we are to be fully alive, fully the person God has made us to be. Everyone has a calling. What is yours?

This is a 'theological' way of looking at life. But it is a way of looking that doesn't require a 'churchy' answer: after all, if the gifts God has given you provoke you to being 'fully alive' as, say, an accountant or perhaps as a

musician, that's great!

For some, though, the contemplation of gifts, skills, talents and passions and the needs of the world leads, inexorably, in one direction – the service of God in the ordained life of the church.

Yesterday afternoon

the Bishop of London ordained 40 men and women to the diaconate in the Cathedral; at the same time more than 20 other ordinands from London were being ordained deacon in other dioceses.

In the Diocese of London we are blessed with an ever-growing number of vocations to the ordained ministry, even if nationally the outlook is far less encouraging. As part of our Capital Vision we have committed ourselves to a 50% increase in the number of candidates for ordination by 2020. Most of these will serve the Church of England in other dioceses. In support of meeting this target, the Diocese of London has created an online microsite called London Callings. It has a number of two-minute video clips profiling people of various ages and traditions living out the call of God across the Diocese -with other stories being added to the site regularly. And in addition there's a simple brochure 'Everyday People' which encourages especially Ethnic Minority vocations.



Prayer, that deep listening to God, is the bedrock of the Church's ministry. As we pray this weekend for the newly ordained in their new please ministries, pray for an increase of vocations - and perhaps use this as invitation to an

consider your own life and calling. The clergy of this parish will be glad to talk and to explore further.

Almighty God, who hast entrusted to thy Church a share in the ministry of thy Son our great High Priest: we pray that by the inspiration of thy Holy Spirit the hearts of many may be moved to offer themselves for the ministry of thy Church, and that, strengthened by his power, they may work for the increase of thy kingdom and set forward the eternal praise of thy name; through Jesus Christ thy Son our Lord, who liveth and reigneth with thee, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, one God, now and for ever. None of us wants to confront evil - and perhaps we instinctively reach for the remote control when the latest images of human atrocity flash onto our screens on the daily news. But for many of us, confronting truth is ultimately more creative than denying it or avoiding it, however briefly painful that may seem. And if we are to do so, and to engage this dimension of our human experience, where better to do it than in good and prayerful company among friends – and with thoughtful guidance along the way.
