

THE THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT 8th March 2015

Transformation



Before and after photographs are the stock in trade of magazine journalism – not least in publications devoted to health and fitness. Which of us, mid-haircut, magazine flipped open in front of us, hasn't felt that surge of desire to possess either the perfectly reworked apartment or the perfectly sculpted body? We can admire beauty – but we are astonishingly drawn in by the presentation of transformation, before and after.

This week BBC Wales presents a programme exploring the history and the psychology of the 'before and after' shot — and, as part of the making of the programme, invited two actors (pictured opposite) to take part in an experiment. The aim: to explore the power of the image. The question: how long would it take to get from 'before' to 'after'? And how long do you think? The answer: two hours!

On the BBC website you can watch a short extract of how to get from A to B! It is not entirely trickery, and there is no photoshopping of the images, but there is a

fair bit of effort into making the 'before' look as bad as possible (harsh flash, slouching posture, no make-up) and the 'after' as good as it can be (with the help, on the way, of some quick muscle-pumping exercise, some spray tan, make-up and generous lighting!). And if it feels like a rather cruel exposé of the deceptive art of magazine photography, the one very positive thing was the affirmation each of the models gained from the exercise. They genuinely felt more confident about themselves afterwards.

We live in a world of presentational artifice in which things are not always what they seem, a world which values the surface of things and how they come across. This Lenten season is an invitation to attend, not to the surface of things, but to their deeper substance – and to ensure that our lifelong transformation is one that begins with heart and mind, shaped by the person of Jesus Christ. And if you've been beguiled, so far this Lent, by the merely superficial, it is not too late to start anew.

ADVANCE NOTICE: Saturday 13 June 2015 - a full-day visit to Chichester. The day will include transportation by coach to and from Chichester departing St




